

## MLSE LAUNCHPAD PARTNERSHIP CRITERIA

1. The Program should result in making a positive impact in youth
2. The Program has the potential to impact the wider community (other than youth directly involved in the program)
3. The Program should promote physical activity, education, vocational training and mental health amongst youth in Ontario.
4. The Program should have funding secured prior to program start date
5. The Program must not contain any trademarks or other material owned by a third party without the express written permission of that third party (which written permission must be submitted with the Proposal).
6. The Program must not contain any offensive, obscene, or sexually suggestive material, propaganda, potentially misleading information, or defamatory or disparaging material about other people or companies, or endorse any form of hate or hate group or terrorist activity.
7. The Program cannot result in discrimination on the basis of gender, race, religion, creed, national origin, disability, handicap, age, sexual orientation, or any other basis prohibited by law, as determined in the sole discretion of MLSE LaunchPad
8. All programming associated with the Program must be accessible on a non-discriminatory basis.
9. The Program cannot support any particular political party or affiliated group and cannot directly promote or speak negatively about any particular religion, political action, legislation or party, or promote or encourage the violation of any law, as determined in the sole discretion of MLSE Foundation.
10. The Program must not promote any activities that may appear unsafe or dangerous, as determined in the sole discretion of MLSE LaunchPad
11. The Program must not relate to controversial subject matter or any subject that is contrary to the interests of MLSE LaunchPad, as determined in the sole discretion of MLSE LaunchPad.
